WFSC Academy Try Out and Selection Policy

Weston Soccer Club adheres to the “open tryouts” format for all Academy teams. For the 2009-10 Season, the US Soccer Federation will have two age groups, the U-18 age group, for players born in calendar years 1991 and 1992, and the U-16 age group, which consists of all players born in calendar years 1993 and 1994. The US Soccer Federation will not be sanctioning an under 14 Academy division, but Weston Soccer Club will be joining 15 other US Academies to form their own U-14 Academy team, adhering to the standards set forth by the Federation.

All players must try out in their own age group on the first day of tryouts. Only the Director of the Academy or the Technical Director has the authority to allow players to try out in an older age group. Player Registration Procedure

You will receive a telephone call from the Coach by the end of Friday following tryouts, advising whether or not a player will be offered a place on an Academy team. If your child accepts a spot on a team and is new to the club, it is **MANDATORY** that you either attend the registration evening scheduled for June 4 from 7:30pm to 9:00pm **OR** give all the necessary paperwork to your team manager prior to the registration evening. **Players who need to try on uniforms for size and did not do so at tryouts must attend the registration evening with a parent.**

Registration Meetings will be held in the Soccer Building located between Fields 1 and 2 at Weston Regional Park.

STEPS TO TAKE AFTER BEING SELECTED:

STEP ONE:

Everyone should register online (*please see next page for instructions*). If payment has been made online please remember to print your receipt and bring it with you to the registration meeting or include it in the paperwork you give the team manager, if they are registering for you. The purpose of online registration is to provide the Club with your up to date information. You will then be included in the communication loop for email news, bulletins, and other information regarding the Club and its membership.

STEP TWO:

Trying on uniforms, if necessary, sample uniforms will be available at tryouts and at registration. Please have players try uniforms on for size as returns cannot be accommodated after the uniforms have been ordered and numbers have been printed on them.

STEP THREE:

Attend the registration meeting if your team manager is not registering the team. This will involve completing the paperwork and may also include attending a team meeting with your coach and Team Manager.

Important documents to bring to the Registration Meeting or provide to your team manager:

1. Check or receipt to confirm online payment.
2. 2 passport size photographs.
3. Copy of birth certificate or passport for all players
4. WFSC Medical Release, notarized
5. WFSC 2009-10 Player/Club Expectations Agreement, signed
6. WFSC Code of Ethics, signed
7. U-16 and U18 Academy Players only, will need to sign and complete all US Soccer Federation requirements.

Online Steps to Register a Player

I. REGISTERING AN EXISTING WFSC PLAYER

In the event that you are an existing player but the database does not recognize you, please follow the steps for new players below (II). If any personal information has changed please update it. Any updates you make will be automatically uploaded to the main frame and saved.

To re-register with the Weston Fury Soccer Club for a new season each player must register online. Go to www.westonsoccer.net and click on **Tryouts**, then click on **Online 2009-10 Season Registration – Selected Players only**.

1. **Click I am currently registered with the WFSC and would like to register for a program or season.**
2. You will now see a split screen. Enter the information into the right hand screen. Enter player information, click continue. Please note that not everyone knows their passwords, however upon filling in the player information you will be given one in a later screen.
3. You will now be asked to register the player or add another player (family member). If you do not have another player to add, **SELECT PROGRAM** and proceed to step 2.
4. If you wish to add another player, click on that option and fill in their contact information.
5. Fill in Player registration form and **SELECT PROGRAM** and proceed to step 2.
6. Check over your information and continue to check out.
7. Read medical release and click to agree or disagree. (Note, if you disagree the registration process will terminate and you will not be able to register.)
8. Choose payment method. We encourage you to pay online as it speeds up the registration process and is easier to administer.
9. Upon completing payment process you will see a page that confirms your registration. Please print two copies of this page, keep one copy for your records and give the other copy to your team manager.

II. REGISTERING A NEW PLAYER (this is for those players who were not previously registered as WFSC players)

In order to register with the Weston Fury Soccer Club for a new season each player must register online. Go to www.westonsoccer.net and click on **Tryouts**, then click on **Online 2009-10 Season Registration – Selected Players only**.

1. **Click I am not currently registered with the WFSC and would like to register for a program or season**
2. Enter contact information, click continue
3. At this stage you will have the option of adding another family member. If you do not have another member to add, **SELECT PROGRAM** and proceed to step 2
4. Check over your information and continue to check out
5. Read medical release and click to agree or disagree. (Note, if you disagree the registration process will terminate and you will not be able to register.)
6. Choose payment method. We encourage you to pay online as it speeds up the registration process and is easier to administer.
7. Upon completing payment process you will now see a page that confirms your registration. Please print two copies of this page, keep one copy for your records and give the other copy to your team manager.

Weston Fury Soccer Club 2009-10 Season Player/Club Expectations Agreement

Congratulations on being selected to join the Weston Fury Soccer Club (WFSC) for the 2009-10 Seasonal Year! Your skills and hard work have earned you a spot in one of the top soccer clubs in the United States. Our coaches and Board of Directors hope that this will be an enjoyable year for you and your family. As part of the process, we want to ensure that you are fully aware and understand the commitments the WFSC is making to you at this time, and our expectations and the obligations incurred by you as a result of accepting the position offered to you. Every player and parent will be asked to acknowledge their understanding of the mutual expectations between you and WFSC. Accepting the position offered obligates each player to pay the **full non-refundable registration fee**, regardless of whether the player after executing this agreement completes the proper paperwork for the issuance of a US Soccer and FYSA player pass or later decides to leave the WFSC prior to the end of the seasonal year.

WFSC WILL PROVIDE THE FOLLOWING:

1. WFSC will provide a comprehensive soccer program, which is designed to maximize each player's full potential. Each player will be assigned to a team that will have a Head Coach, who is overseen by WFSC full time staff, including the WFSC Technical Director, and Academy staff. All of the WFSC Staff; Head Coaches, Program Directors and the Technical Director will be contracted directly by WFSC. There will be no additional "training fees" for the basic services and uniform package described below.
2. In an effort to develop every player, teams will train and play games. The U-16 and U-18 Academy teams will be entered into a US Academy League operated by the US Soccer Federation. The Academy League will be playing exclusively Academy teams throughout the US. The Staff will post the travel roster in advance of all out of area games. Each player is required to start in 25% of the regular season games.
3. U-14 Academy team will maintain a "Calendar year", January 1, 1995 through December 31, 1996 for player selection. The U14 Academy team will participate in a U-14 Academy league, sponsored by US Club Soccer, which will compete against other Academy teams from the US, which will use the "Calendar year" ages. In addition, the U-14 Academy team will be registered to FYSA, which they would be eligible to participate in all U15 FYSA events, including State Cup.
4. Where appropriate, WFSC Academy teams may enter into "Showcase" events for which the staff will select the players to attend, on an event by event basis.
5. WFSC will provide a Nike uniform package as part of their registration fee. The uniform package will include; two jerseys, two shorts, two pairs of socks and two practice T-shirts. Other items, such as warm ups and bags, will be the responsibility of the player or team.

PLAYERS & PARENTS RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. WFSC is a premier competitive soccer club; there is NO guarantee of minimum playing time. The respective Program Directors, Directors of Coaching and the Technical Director will handle all unresolved disputes between coaches and players. In the interest of player development, players will occasionally cross-train or guest play between gender, age groups, and/or guest play outside the Club (e.g. college showcase opportunities). Such guest playing opportunities will only be with the express pre-approval of the respective Program Directors, Directors of Coaching or the Technical Director.
2. All travel expenses will be the responsibility of each player. We will travel as a group, divide expenses by the number of players traveling and collect the money in advance of traveling. WFSC is aware of the significant expense involved in participating in the Academy and will make every effort to keep expenses to a minimum. Team expenses may include tournament fees, extra soccer gear; coaches travel reimbursement, referees fees for tournaments and other non-league games, and travel costs associating with attending these events. The team may seek and receive donations or, with Club pre-approval, fundraise to defray these expenses. To the extent such donations and/or fundraising amounts are deposited and credited to a team's account; they may be used to pay for such expenses. In the event a

player requests to be released from the WFSC prior to the completion of the soccer seasonal year, the player agrees to pay the WFSC any outstanding amounts owed, including a nine hundred (\$900.00) dollar withdrawal fee, prior to any release being processed.

3. Notwithstanding a player's position with the Club in a preceding year, WFSC teams are decided by the technical staff and no guarantees are made as to a player's selection by the Club or if selected to which team or age group within the Club a player will be assigned. All team events, i.e. practices, games, and tournaments are mandatory. Additional practices may be scheduled during the season at the coach's discretion. Participation levels will be monitored by the technical staff and playing time and player placement on a team may be affected during the current or future seasons.
4. The respective Directors of the Academy and the Technical Director will work together to determine the appropriate programming and schedule for each team and player. All tournament entries and other soccer related activities will be pre-approved by the appropriate Program Director and/or the Technical Director.
5. Each player and parent has received and read the WFSC Code of Ethics and WFSC Code of Conduct for Travel and agrees to abide by these requirements. By signing below, each player and parent accepts a position with the WFSC and agrees to act in a respectful manner at all activities, practices, games, travel, etc, and serve as role models to others to maintain the integrity of ourselves, our team, and all of WFSC. WFSC is a US Federation, FYSA and US Club affiliated organization and its players and parents will conduct themselves in accordance with and be governed by US Soccer, WFSC, FYSA and US Club policies and rules at all times.
6. Privacy notice and distribution of electronic mail and postal mailing addresses. For both internal and external use, it is acknowledged that WFSC may compile and distribute email and postal mailing addresses and/or lists, and may utilize soccer photographs and video of the named individuals. I consent to such uses and waive all rights to compensation.
7. All injuries must be reported within 90 days of the date of the injury.

WFSC CODE OF ETHICS

All players, coaches and spectators will be bound by the following Code of Ethics while participating in WFSC sanctioned events.

Players

- I will encourage good sportsmanship from fellow players, coaches, officials and parents at all times.
- I will remember that soccer is an opportunity to learn and have fun.
- I deserve to play in an environment that is free of drugs, tobacco, and alcohol; and expect everyone to refrain from their use at all soccer games, events and activities.
- I will do the best I can each day, remembering that all players have talents and weaknesses the same as I do.
- I will treat my coaches, other players and coaches, game officials, other administrators, and fans with respect at all times; regardless of race, sex, creed, or abilities, and I will expect to be treated accordingly.
- I will concentrate on playing soccer always giving my best effort.
- I will play by the rules at all times.
- I will place the emotional and physical well being of all players ahead of any personal desire to win.
- I will at all times control my temper, resisting the temptation to retaliate.
- I will always exercise self control.
- Conduct during competition towards play of the game and all officials shall be in accordance with appropriate behavior and in accordance with FIFA's "Laws of the Game", and in adherence to FYSA rules.
- While traveling, I shall conduct myself in a manner so as to be a credit to myself, my team, and the club.
- Alcohol, illegal drugs and unauthorized prescription drugs shall not be possessed, consumed or distributed before, during or after any game or at any other time at the field and/or game complex.

Parents/Spectators

- I will encourage good sportsmanship by demonstrating positive support for all players, coaches, game officials, club officials, league officials, and administrators at all times.
- I will place the emotional and physical well being of all players ahead of any personal desire to win.
- I will support the coaches, officials, and administrators working with my child, in order to encourage a positive and enjoyable experience for all.
- I will remember that the game is for the players not for the adults.
- I will ask my child to treat other players, coaches, game officials, club officials, league officials, administrators, and fans with respect.
- I will always be positive.
- I will always allow the coach to be the only coach.
- I will not get into arguments with the opposing team's parents, players, or coaches.
- I will not come onto the field for any reason during the game unless requested by an official to do so.
- I will not criticize game officials.
- Alcohol, illegal drugs and unauthorized prescription drugs shall not be possessed, consumed or distributed before, during or after any game or at any other time at the field and/or game complex.

Failure to comply may result in the suspension of your privilege to participate in WFSC sanctioned events, for the following periods:

- 1st offense suspension minimum thirty (30) days to a maximum of five (5) years
- 2nd offense suspension for a minimum of one (1) year to a maximum of Ten (10) years
- 3rd offense suspension for a minimum of five (5) years to a maximum of fifty (50) years

NOTE: Any individual charged with a violation of this Code of Ethics shall be afforded due process as defined in FYSA's rule section 600 before the implementation of any suspension. WFSC does however reserve the right to temporarily suspend any individual, without due process, if they feel the situation and/or time constraints require it.

WFSC Player Code Of Conduct For Travel

Our off the field behavior and character are as important as our on the field performance.

The following are the WESTON FURY SOCCER CLUB guidelines, rules, and regulations that must be adhered to while traveling.

At the coach's discretion, players may be sent home at additional expense to the parent if they violate serious behavior rules such as related to drugs, drinking, illegal activities, tobacco products or having members of the opposite sex in rooms at any time.

FURY SPONSORSHIP / OFFICAL NIKE GEAR

All members of the WFSC are expected to cooperate with our current sponsors in a reasonable fashion as requested. Specifically, traveling Fury players must please make sure that your uniform and all uniform accessories, including warm-ups and equipment bags, are compliant with club policies. We ask that you support the club's apparel and equipment sponsor, Nike, by using Nike shoes, balls, shin guards and other products whenever possible.

Weston traveling teams are asked to participate in the club's hotel sponsorship program.

TRAVEL DRESS / BEHAVIOR / DECORUM

Weston players must adhere to our relationship with NIKE as the official apparel/equipment sponsor of the WFSC.

Players must wear proper attire such as Nike Polo tops and Khaki bottoms. The minimal standard dress code while traveling will be no cut offs, no hats. Clothes shall "fit"; nothing too tight or too loose. No holes or tears in the clothing shall be present. Disrespectful slogans, political statements, disrespectful wording or statements shall not be displayed on the being. A higher standard may be established by the Head Coach when desired. At no time will the Head Coach set a lesser standard then set forth in the Rules and Regulations.

ROOM REQUIREMENTS

At no time will anyone of the opposite gender be allowed in each others rooms while club travel is taking place. Players are expected to stay in their assigned room or with parents/guardians.

TRAVEL CURFEW

The Head Coach will determine a team curfew. The Club recommended curfew is no later than 11:00 pm in the time zone you are currently staying for any age group.

FURY TRAVEL RESPONSIBILITIES

Players are expected to travel, stay, and participate with the team through out the entire event. The entire event is classified as when the player arrives at the home airport or point of departure through when the player returns to the home airport, or point of return from the trip, or at the conclusion of the specific tournament or event. Any exceptions will be granted and determined by the Head Coach.

As a common practice, all participants on the trip are expected to be polite, positive, well-mannered, cooperative, good sports, respectful and considerate of others - those you encounter along the way as well as those with whom you are traveling. Rooms, vehicles, and premises need to be kept clean.

There are times when players may be without direct adult supervision. When this occurs, a designated adult must know where you are and when you will be back. At the same time, it is always your responsibility to a) know how to find one of the adults, b) know when and where you are expected to be next, and c) be there on time. When you without adult supervision, you must always follow the "Rule of Three" - at least three players must be together.
